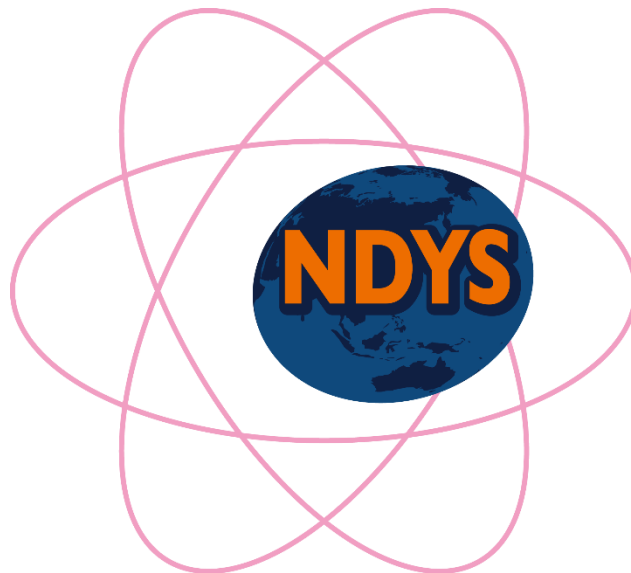

Purpose

In January 2005, 10 years from the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake, the United Nations World Conference on Disaster Reduction was held in Kobe. On this occasion, the project 'Natural Disaster Youth Summit'¹ has launched by communicating with children from Hyogo and other countries. Under the support of Hyogo Prefecture, UNESCO and other organizations, NDYS started as innovative learning project utilizing ICTs. It announced the first NDYS declaration: "Try to feel, try to learn, try to share", Let's learn Disaster Risk Reduction education and built a global network of disaster risk reduction education.

After nine years from the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake, a large earthquake of seismic intensity 7 has occurred in Niigata Chuetsu region. In 1964, the Niigata earthquake, which is the largest earthquake after World War II and the second largest from the Great Kanto Earthquake occurred. People had a big shock since many had forgotten the fear of earthquakes. People in Niigata experienced many natural disasters in the past. In each occasion, the victims of disasters stood up and reconstructed their lives. This is the history of Niigata. We would like to learn the lesson from them. With the support from people in Niigata, we host the NDYS2016 in NIIGATA. By collaborating with 'Kotolympic2016 in Niigata' which is one of the events of 64th Niigata City Performing Arts Festival, both events will be more fruitful.

In the 21 century, classrooms in the world are connected and children can learn the lessons of the past disasters in the world. They share the wisdom of disaster risk reduction of various countries and regions. The lessons are learned to protect lives and to reduce disaster risk.

As the Great East Japan Earthquake occurred, the importance of disaster risk reduction and mitigation of the region has been reviewed again. In March 2015, the United Nations World Conference on Disaster Reduction was held in Sendai. In the conference, it was recognized that a better reconstruction is important in the recovery process. This year, followed by southern Taiwan earthquake, Kumamoto earthquakes occurred. It is a challenge that we must face without fail.

In January 2016, Natural Disaster Youth Summit started the efforts to realize the United Nations sustainable development goals SDGs² in order to expand the Disaster Risk Reduction Education globally from the view point of sustainable development. Specifically, we focus the theme of "disaster risk reduction and mitigation and reconstruction" of the towns inhabited. We are aiming at promoting learning model of disaster risk reduction education by active learning utilizing ICTs.

Our theme this year is Climate Change and Disaster Reduction, Mitigation, and Reconstruction in our town. In addition to domestic participants, about 100 participants from 10 countries and regions will start communication with the theme 'Disaster Risk Reduction'.

Mr. Masaharu Tashiro will make a keynote lecture. The title is 'Disaster Reduction, Port town Niigata and Children.'

Children of Niigata will present their results of the disaster prevention education.

Students of NDYS schools of the world will make presentations about their cases of disaster risk

reduction education, by selecting natural disasters they face. They also introduce a disaster safety map they made by researching their neighborhood. In addition, they will think about the abnormal weather and climate change caused by several reasons, and discuss what they can do, and explores the solutions.

In addition, through interaction among the Taisho koto lovers who gathered from various parts of Japan and the young generations through the music, they feel the importance of snuggling up in mind. The young people may find and suggest reconstruction measures of the weaken hearts.

The young people will adopt the Niigata Declaration and announce to the world, and to the future.

The conference will be held aiming at developing of human resources who will be able to solve the global problems and be a leader in their local and global society in this rapidly changing world.

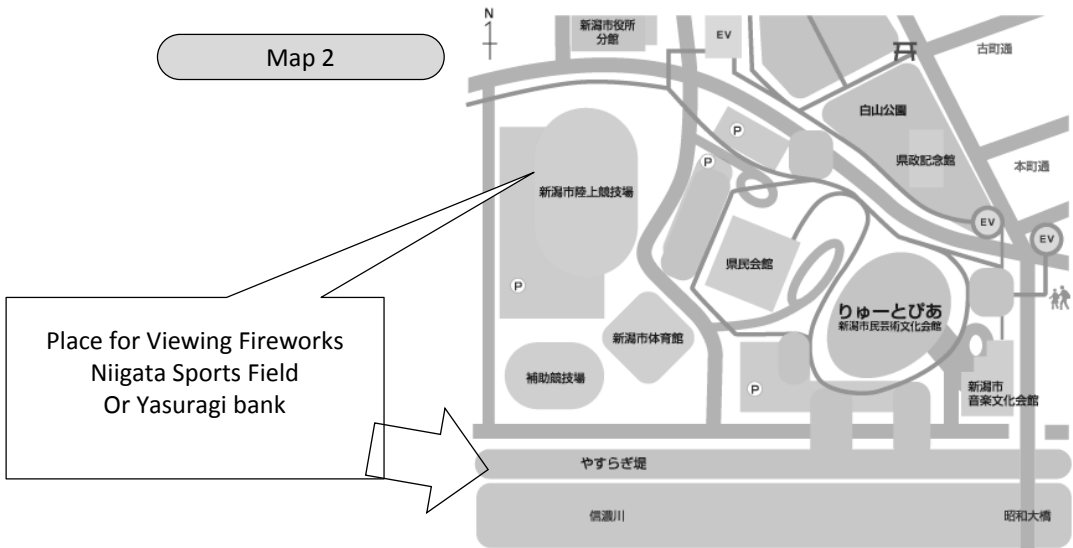

Natural Disaster Youth Summit 2016

We host "Natural Disaster Youth Summit 2016 in Niigata" in August 3-8, 2016 in Niigata City, Niigata Prefecture.

In NDYS2016, we are working together with iEARN Taisho Koto project for reconstruction of traumatic heart after the disaster by utilizing the power of music (Taisho Koto). We will hold the 64th Niigata city Art Festival "Kotolympic 2016 in Niigata" at the same time.

Summary

This is a project in which children will learn the importance of human lives and how to reduce disaster impacts such as earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, wildfires, floods, hurricanes, landslides, tsunamis, droughts and so on through the communication and collaboration with global friends.

Description

NDYS was first organized in Hyogo in May 2004 and started from September 2004, commemorating 10th year of great Hanshin Awaji Earthquake, Japan in 1995. We learned the importance of human lives and preparedness for disasters.

In recent years, it has been pointed out that extreme abnormal weather caused by climate change may be linked to an increase in large-scale natural disasters. Natural disasters such as heavy rain and floods are increasing in many parts of the world, and they become major obstacles not only to people's lives, but also sustainable development. To take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts is an urgent global issue.

Slogan: Communication saves lives!

Our goal: Build the safer place to live in for everyone in this planet

By experiencing various disasters, different knowledge and information to reduce their impact are accumulated in local communities. By sharing this knowledge and information, we can prepare against future disasters and take actions to combat climate change and its impacts. Let us maintain continuous efforts and transfer these efforts to the next generation. Our ultimate goal is to enhance awareness of the impact of natural disasters on families, schools and local communities around the world through young people's actions.

NDYS will build a global disaster management education network utilizing Information and Communications Technology (ICT). Let us communicate with each other and contribute to the healthier planet.

Students will do research on the environment near their school and put this information in the map, including where is safe, where is dangerous and places they love and are proud of. your map on the Gallery of iEARN Collaboration Center, too. Students will have discussion through Video-conferencing and on the iEARN forum of NDYS.

2) NDYS Teddy Bear Exchange and Kid's Safety Bag

As a subsidiary program, the NDYS Teddy Bears (NDYS Little Ambassadors) will be exchanged between partner schools to strengthen the friendly bond at the NDYS conference. Each School can make Kid's Safety Bag (Emergency bag), too.

3) Discussion on the iEARN NDYS forum

Theme: 'My experience of natural disasters'

Students who want to tell their experiences of natural disasters can put messages on the NDYS forum.

As the final event of the project, we will get together at the Natural Disaster Youth Summit 2016 in Niigata, Japan. This is a collaborative gathering with Taisho koto project. We will make an exhibition of maps and oral presentations. Through this program, students will grow as global citizens who take actions and share their knowledge of disaster management with local people. We expect students to be NDYS Ambassadors to let people understand the importance of preparedness for the potential disasters. Their schools will be the center of community education for disaster management. We welcome teachers and civic volunteers to support students' learning and activities

4) Original Activities at your school

NDYS welcome the original activities done at your school. Introduce the original activities at your school or your community on the iEARN forum.

5) Special Feature for NDYS2016 :

'Healing Power of Music from Trauma after Disasters'

As you may know natural disasters leave behind long-lasting and severe trauma. Music can help people with their recovery. It will be wonderful, if we can share such music. As we believe the healing power of music, NDYS has decided to collaborate with iEARN Taisho-koto project this year. We would like you to introduce the music of your country which heals people's hearts. It will be ideal if you can send us your video or up load it onto YouTube. We would like you to play the music at the Art Festival "Kotolympic 2016 in Niigata".
